Church Computer is fixed by New Century in Abilene. The service was done before an estimate was given. Because of that, Marion and Dwight Kamm are going to pay for a maintenance fee and will donate that service to the New Basel Church. This will allow him to fix the computer remotely if needed.

New Business:

M/S/C to pay bills that were presented. Peggy Meuli moved we pay the bills. Pam O'Neal seconded the motion.

Marion Kamm, our Church Secretary, attended the council meeting to ask a few questions. Marion is taking care of the mail and putting the bulletin together. She is donating her time and not charging the church. She is keeping track of her hours and miles so our church knows what it takes to be the church secretary.

Nominating Committee- Chris Bethe has agreed to be on the nominating committee and Pam will talk to a few church members. If you feel you would like to be on the committee let a council member know. They will sign a contract and pay rent and whatever utilities we require. Vote was taken and passed unanimously.

- Day 1: "The partridge in a pear tree" is Jesus Christ
- Day 2: "Two turtle doves" are the Old and New Testaments
- Day 3: "Three French Hens" stand for Faith, Hope, and Charity
- Day 4: "Four Calling Birds" are the four Gospels of Matthew, Mark Luke, and John
- Day 5: "Five Golden Rings" recall the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.
- Day 6: "Six Geese A-Laying" stand for the six days of creation
- Day 7: "Seven Swans Are Swimming" represent the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit: Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy
- Day 8: "Eight Maids A-Milking" are the eight Beatitudes
- Day 9: "Nine Ladies Dancing" are the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit: Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self-Control
- Day 10: "Ten Lords Are Leaping" are the Ten Commandments
- Day 11: "Eleven Pipers Piping" stand for the eleven faithful Disciples
- Day 12: "Twelve Drummers Drumming" symbolizes the twelve points in the Apostle's Creed.
