Getting To the Barn

The story is told of a farmer who one day decided to plow the south forty acres in his field. However, his tractor needed oil, so he started for the barn to get it, but on the way, he noticed that the pigs hadn't been fed.

As he neared the corncrib, he saw a pile of sacks which reminded him that the potatoes were sprouting. On the way to the potato pit, he passed the woodpile and remembered that the kitchen stove was burning low and needed wood.

While picking up the wood, he saw that one of his chickens was ailing, so he dropped the wood to tend to the chicken and so distraction after distraction came along until the end of the day — and he still hadn't oiled the tractor or plowed the south forty.

Brethren and friends, the only way we will ever "get to the barn" of Christian service is to get our priorities in order (Matthew 6:33). The farmer in the above story didn't have any priorities — he just "rolled with the flow" of events occurring around him.

Is our Christian life ever like this trip to the barn? Do we ever have grand visions of achieving great service, but the service never gets done? Do we have too many distractions, allowing them to interfere with our goal of being a productive servant in God's kingdom?

There's no question that our life contains plenty of pigs to feed, wood to cut and chickens to doctor, but we can't allow them to get in our way of serving God.

If we will make the commitment to serve God (Joshua 24:14-15) and go the "extra mile" (Matthew 5:41), God will make a way for us to "get to the barn."

A new email address was created so they can make contact with potential pastors. (Job Wanted) ads have been posted on Facebook and at Manhattan Christian College (that post has not been put up yet). We have received 2 applicants.

Sunday School Committee- Jessica also reported on behalf of the Sunday School Committee on Christmas events for New Basel. The Sunday School Committee has already discussed going virtual and has prerecorded each Sunday school class. The recording will be put together by Emily Haynes. They were not able to record the song portion of the children's program yet but have brainstormed ideas if we do not come back to in person church before the Christmas Eve service.

Old Business:

Search Committee- Mitch and Dwight talked to Edith Guffey about being in the UCC. She said they have not received anything saying we would like to leave the UCC. If we would like the UCC to help us with our search they are willing to, but we would have to do our regular offerings. Pam has also talked to a Church in Abilene that is non-denominational and how they find preachers. Bob O'Neal has taken that information to the Search Committee.

New Business:

M/S/C to pay bills that were presented. Pam O'Neal moved we pay the bills. Francis Anderson seconded the motion.

Church Budget for 2021 was discussed and will be presented at the 2020 Annual Meeting.

Annual Meeting Date: January 31st. We will have a short church service followed by our annual meeting. No meal will be provided. At the annual meeting, we will take a vote on removing New Basel from the UCC. If we would like to be removed from the UCC we need to send a

congregational vote and our By-Laws showing that the UCC does not own any of New Basel's property.

Covid 19 Decisions- Dickinson County is requiring masks for indoor activities. A business can be fined up to \$500 if caught not wearing masks. At this point they have left churches out of the wording. We will continue to keep our church doors open and stay up to date on new mandates.

Church Council discussed and voted to move our Christmas Eve Service to a virtual program. It will be posted on our Facebook page.

We will still take a Christmas Eve Service Offering. Check can be mailed to the Church at 1175 1100 Ave Abilene, KS 67410. The charity of choice this year will be St. Jude Children's Hospital. Please put St. Jude's or Christmas Eve Charity in the memo area of your check.
