Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Summer is nearly over. School will resume soon, the oppressive heat will eventually give way to crisp Autumn mornings and dew laden grass, and seemingly limitless hues of reds and golds will cover the landscape.

But it has been a difficult year, as was the one before it. What's more, people in general seem to think that things will get worse before they get better. A recent poll of 'likely voters' showed that only 37% think the country is headed in the right direction! Politics, the economy, and the lingering struggle with COVID-19 seem to weigh heavily on our collective minds.

The verses above remind me of the importance of remembering the many blessings that God pours out on us each and every day. It seems to me that, as humans, it is our nature to overlook or forget the things that God does for us, both the common everyday blessings, and the momentous life changing blessings that occur less frequently. It also seems that our human nature is to focus on negative things instead of positive things. We sometimes take for granted the presence of God in our lives. The danger here is that we can grow so accustomed to the blessings of God that we can't see God's presence in times of despair. or that we train ourselves to see only hardships and ignore how God is active in our lives and world.

It is important to remember God's goodness, and we have to be intentional about doing it!

Take a moment to read Joshua 4:1-7. This passage takes place as the Israelites cross the river Jordan and enter the Promised Land, and they are told to build a memorial as they do.

Building memorials is an important thing in our spiritual lives as well, not only because it reminds us of the things the Lord has done for us, but it also teaches our children and those around us of God's providence. We need to find ways to remind ourselves of God's involvement in our lives, whether that be in sharing our stories with family and friends, or writing them down in a journal, or building an actual physical monument.

By placing things in our lives that remind us of the ways we are blessed, something amazing happens. We teach ourselves. We teach our children and friends. We teach our co-workers. We encourage other Christians. And we strengthen our ability to endure difficult seasons like the one we're currently experiencing.

Don't overlook what God has done and is doing. Train yourself to look for His blessings. Talk about them and figure out a way to remember them in the years to come. And teach your kids to do the same. They're going to need encouragement too!


