Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

One of the songs we hear a lot around this time of year is "We Three Kings



of Orient Are". It is based on the passage from Matthew 2, where the gospel writer relates the story of how those famous visitors from the East came to worship Jesus. When you try to match up the song to the

story, however, there are some glaring difficulties.

Take, for example, the number three. The song says Three Kings, but the Bible makes no mention of how many there are. True, there are three gifts that are eventually presented to Jesus, which is where the number presumably came from. Also, the song calls them Kings, but the Bible does not. They are called either wise men or magi, depending on the translation, but definitely not kings! As for the song's claim that they came from the Orient, well that's pure conjecture. Probably not true.

So there is a lot we don't know about who these people were. It is almost as if their identity is unimportant to Matthew. Strange, then, that their gifts should be named so accurately. Perhaps even more strange is that the significance of these gifts is not spelled out.

We all know what gold is, and what it is used for. Gold, however, would have been a really rare thing for a peasant infant to receive. It would normally have been given to kings: it was a royal gift.

The frankincense mentioned a unique gift as well. Made from dried tree sap, it was powdered and used in flour or burnt with offerings. When frankincense was burnt, the smoke was thought to represent the prayers of the people, rising up to God. It was associated with life at the Temple.

If the first two gifts were strange, then the third is downright bizarre. Myrrh was something like an embalming fluid that was used to anoint a person who had died. The Egyptians used it in their mummification process. A highly unusual gift!

Taken together, however, we see that the wise men understood something profound. Their gifts show that they thought of Jesus as a King and as a Priest, and that they had some inclination that He came to die. Very wise, indeed!

And so the wise men worshipped, and they worshipped truly. Their gifts cost them wealth, not to mention the time invested in bringing them and the effort involved in getting there. When we worship God today, we do these same things – recognizing that Jesus is King and our High Priest that died for us, we worship with our money, time, and effort. And when we at last meet Jesus, just like the wise men we cannot go back the way we came. We cannot truly meet Jesus and go back to being the same person we were before!

In the coming New Year, I pray that each of you worship **Jesus Christ, God's** 



**Son, and Savior**, recognizing Him as the King and High Priest that died for you. I also pray that you might be

unable to return the way you came, and become the people God knows you can be! When that happens, no matter your path, your journey will end in paradise with the Lord!
