Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As Spring begins to erupt all around us, we are reminded of the beauty of new beginnings, the splendor of new life, and the precious presence of God's hand in nature. I am also reminded of the importance of slowing down to take stock of the many blessings that God pours out on us each and every day. Sometimes it seems like we are too busy to notice the presence of God in our lives and in the world. It is important, however, that we do so, both for our own spiritual welfare and for the example we set for our friends and family. Taking stock of God's blessings really happens in two parts.

I was reminded of one of the really terrific hymns this week — *Count your blessings, name them one by one, count your blessings, see what God has*

done. It seems to me that as humans, our nature is to overlook or forget the things that God



does for us, both the common everyday blessings and the momentous, life changing blessings that occur more infrequently. We sometimes take for granted the presence of God in our lives. The danger here is that we can grow so accustomed, so used to the blessings of God that we can't see God's presence in times of despair.

I also think it is important to intentionally remember. In Joshua 3, we read about how the nation of Isreal crossed the river Jordan when the Lord stopped the waters. But then in the opening verses of chapter 4, the Lord tells Joshua to make a pile of rocks as a memorial. The Lord said to Joshua that

it was "to serve as a sign among you. In the future, when your children ask you,

'What do these stones mean?' tell them that the flow of the Jordan was cut off before the ark of the covenant of the LORD.



When it crossed the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. These stones are to be a memorial to the people of Israel forever." Josh 4:6-7

Building memorials is an important thing in our spiritual lives as well, not only because it reminds us of the things the Lord has done for us, but it also teaches our children and those around us of God's providence. We need to find ways to remind ourselves of God's involvement in our lives, whether that be in sharing our stories with family or friends or writing them down in a journal, or building monuments. By placing things in our lives that remind us of the ways we are blessed, we teach ourselves and those around us.

Being aware of God's presence, in our lives and in the world around us, is not something that happens by accident. We need to take time to intentionally notice God's blessings and, as the song says, count up as many as you can think of. But we also need to intentionally remember and tell others too. It's good for us, and it's good for them!
