Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Once again, the weather turns hot, the children are out of school for summer break, the sports channels are full of baseball, and people gear up for their Independence Day celebrations. There are guests to invite, houses to clean, food to prepare, and fireworks to buy. And somewhere in the middle of all the activity, we (hopefully) remember the United States, its birth, and the men and women who struggled to establish it.

It was on July 4th that the Declaration of Independence was published: hence the date of our holiday. In this document, representatives assembled



from their various states declared their independence from Great Britain. But in doing so, they repeatedly referenced God, calling him Nature's God, Creator, and Supreme Judge, as well as stating a reliance upon divine Providence. Despite what so many today



would try to tell us, the authors of this document clearly wished to be independent of British rule, but *dependent* on God.

And one of the biggest ways they acknowledged their dependence on God was through prayer. The very first National Day of Prayer was in fact held in 1775, the year before the Declaration of Independence was signed. But before and after July 4, 1776, Congressional meetings and government functions of all kinds began with prayer. This was not only to ask for divine Guidance, but to acknowledge the country's dependence upon God.

Prayer is, at its most basic level, a Declaration of *Dependence*. It is an acknowledgement of God's sovereignty; a declaration that God is worthy of our praise. It is an agreement with John 15:5, in which Jesus describes the relationship between a vine and its branches and says, "apart from me, you can do nothing." This doesn't mean that without God's blessing that nothing would ever get done. Indeed, there are lots of things that people do in this world that Jesus has no part of. No, it means that nothing worthwhile can be done; nothing Godly can get accomplished without God. Prayer, in its many forms, acknowledges this vine-and-branches relationship.

So amidst the business and craziness that is the 4th of July, slow down for just a moment. Pause at the beginning of your celebration for a word of prayer. Give thanks for the founders of this nation, the authors of the Declaration of Independence, and give thanks for their dependence on God. And in so doing, proclaim once again your own dependence on Him.
