Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Ever notice how time seems to behave differently, depending on what's going on around you? Time is such a funny thing. Sometimes an hour or a day can seem so short. Hence, the saying "Time flies when you're having fun!" Sometimes, however, the minutes and hours can drag on forever. Waiting for a phone call or a repairman can make a clock seem to stand still (feel free to keep your long-windedpreacher jokes to yourself here <sup>(G)</sup>). Time, it seems to us, behaves differently.

Regardless of our impressions of how time passes, there are some general rules that apply. For us, time flows in one direction: from the past to the present, and on toward the future. Time does not flow backward, from the future or present to the past. This is how we understand the laws of cause and effect that we encounter every day; the present time is affected by things that happened in the past, and things that happen in the present may affect the future, but not the past. This is what humans are used to, but this is *not* what happens when we are talking about the church and the reign of God. Allow me to explain.

You see, God is not bound by time like we are. Indeed, God created time, so how would he? In his book, *Evangelism After Christendom*, Bryan Stone talks about salvation and the church's role in it. "The salvation offered by the church to the world is not something it first receives and then offers to others. It is received only and insofar as it is offered to others." What this means is that a future cause, specifically the church's future salvation, has a present effect, which is the church offering salvation to others. Technically, it is offering something it has not yet received or experienced! Other examples are easy to

conjure. Every week, most Christians pray The Lord's Prayer. Depending on what church you go to, you ask the Lord to forgive your trespasses/debts/sins, but then follow it up with some variation of as we forgive others. This means that we receive forgiveness from God only and insofar as we forgive others. Another present effect that depends on a future event! Furthermore, as Rev. Billy Graham notes, "Our faith becomes stronger as we express it; a growing faith is a sharing faith." Certainly, Christians are called to share their faith with others, and as they do so, they receive even more faith! Normal time does not permit someone to share something and end up with more, but such is the nature of the reign of God. Time appears to run backwards. And you thought time behaved differently when it only travelled in one direction!

The implications of this for Christians today are many. Perhaps the greatest, though, is that we don't need to worry so much about not having everything perfect before we enter into His service. I think that when it comes to talking to our friends about Jesus, or leading a Sunday School class, or whatever, many people don't because they are too intimidated. People think they don't know the Bible well enough, or think they don't have enough faith, or look at their own life and the mess they're in, and think they need to get all their ducks in a row before committing. God's Kingdom doesn't work like that. It is in the sharing our faith, our knowledge, and God, that we gain faith, knowledge, and God!
