And oh, how it rained! Our current dry spell notwithstanding, Kansas thunderstorms can be really nasty when they want to. Eventually, however, the storm eased up to a mere sprinkle. People, eager to keep their place in line, emerged from their shelters to stand on the sidewalk, and only a few were smart enough to have brought their umbrellas.

It was here that I noticed how people were acting, under our less-than-ideal circumstances. One man seemed to be as angry as the storm, yelling at his kids while he dealt with his own stress. Most of us were calmer, yet we merely endured our sentence of standing in the rain while already soaked. I was in this category. Yet standing in line behind me was a girl, perhaps 6 or 7 years old, who was playing in the stream that ran down off her umbrella, smiling to herself and having a grand time.

I think we all can see which of us displayed better the Fruits of the Spirit listed above. While not guilty this particular time, there have been many instances where I vented my anger upon people around me that didn't deserve it. While this is obviously not Christlike, neither is the quiet displeasure and internal grumbling while waiting in soggy misery. But it was this little girl demonstrated to anyone caring to observe that there is no real reason to be miserable at such a time.

What I would like us all to notice, though, is that the Fruits of the Spirit are not just present on Sunday mornings, or only sometimes, but also in everyday life. Especially when life's storms come and dump on us. If we truly follow Christ, patience and joy will spread to every part of our lives.

Let's try to be like that little girl, seeing opportunities for joy wherever we are!



The following is a list of immediate needs to the pantry:

Baking Supplies: cake and muffin mixes, frosting, oil, flour, sugar **Canned Goods**: fruit, vegetables, soup, condiments, meat substitutes

Cereal: hot cereal, cold cereal, cereal and breakfast bars **Cleaning Supplies**: laundry soap, dish soap, hand soap **Paper Goods**: toilet tissue, paper towels, napkins, facial tissue

Pastas: macaroni, noodles, spaghetti

Personal Hygiene: shampoo, conditioner, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrushes, women's feminine products, disposable diapers, men's shaving supplies, hand and body lotions and creams
