Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

So now that the holidays are over, I hope that everyone has had a chance to relax for a bit and exhale; to recover from all the stresses of Thanksgiving and Christmas and to settle back into a more comfortable routine. The beginning of January is a wonderful time, when the fond memories of children opening presents with glee and of sumptuous feasts with loved ones still glow warmly in our hearts, but still before our credit card bills arrive detailing the extent of our extravagance. It is now that I would like to ask a question. Now, when the shock of the readings from our bathroom scales has worn off somewhat, and while the lingering dismay motivates the vow "never again!" It is now that I would like to ask, "Have you been a good and faithful steward of the gifts that God has given you? Have you behaved as God would have you behave? Have you spent as God would have you spend?"

At least part of stewardship refers to financial resources, and at least part of being a good steward of the financial resources you have been given relates to **credit card debt.** The average American pays around \$2000 per year to their credit cards, and 1 person in 4 takes all year to pay off what they spent for Christmas last year. Credit cards enable us to purchase extravagant gifts we should not, and we waste money on interest rates. This is not good stewardship.

Another part of stewardship refers to the spiritual gifts we have been given. Spiritual gifts are things like leadership, service, and faith. For a more complete list, see Romans 12, 1 Corinthians 12, and Ephesians 4. Spiritual gifts are not given to people for private benefit; they are for the betterment of the **believing community**. This means that if you are not using your gifts in your church, you should be! Share spiritual gifts with others.

This also applies to sharing money. Christmas seems to focus more and more on consumerism. The commercials suggesting that we buy a new car in order to 'save this Christmas' are some of the worst offenders. But being a good steward of our gifts means that we **avoid extravagance and luxury**, and that we place other's needs ahead of our wants. As Randy Alcorn put it, "God prospers me not to raise my standard of living, but to raise my standard of giving."

Sharing money is related to tithing, but it's not the same. Tithing is the Old Testament command to return 10 percent of flocks and crops to God. Since we are no longer under the Law, we have Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit, and the priesthood of all believers. We have also been blessed with living in the greatest and wealthiest country in the world, besides the countless blessings we encounter every day. So are modern Christians supposed to tithe? "Let each one do just as he has purposed in his heart; not grudgingly or under compulsion; for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7). God leaves the decision up to you!


