Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Maybe you heard of a recent product recall, in which several brands of Italian cold cuts were suspected of being contaminated with Listeria monocytogenes. The decision to pull nearly 53,000 pounds of product off the shelves came from fears that customers could become sick if they were to eat contaminated food.

We hear about product recalls like this, it seems, with increasing regularity. It is not uncommon for news broadcasts to tell listeners about recalls on everything from baby seats to vehicles to peanut butter, even to the point now where listeners barely notice another recall has been issued. Even so, when you think of the thousands and millions of products available for public purchase (even at the local grocery store, let alone online) the number of recalls is pretty small by comparison. This is because companies spend an enormous amount of money trying to find and fix problems before their products hit the market.

There are several reasons to spend money like that. One reason is simply safety, like in our example here.

Manufacturers want their customers to be safe! And not just to avoid lawsuits, either – repeat customers are good business. But another reason is because *companies try to associate the company name with quality and dependability*. They fix problems because their name is on the product.

A long time ago, Ford came out with a brilliant ad campaign, telling potential customers that their company slogan was 'Quality Is Job One." The goal of this campaign was to reassure customers, and to associate the company name and reputation with excellence and trustworthiness.

But did you know that God feels the same way about his name? Psalm 25:11 reads, "For Your name's sake, O Lord, pardon my guilt, for it is great." You see, we are Christians, and as such, we bear the name of Christ. Each and every one of us has had problems, of course. But when we give our lives to Christ, we are 'recalled', so to speak. Then, when people around us ask about our shortcomings, we can say that yes, we are flawed, but God is perfecting us.

God wants his name to be associated with excellence and dependability because God IS excellent and dependable. God fixes problems, God fixes us, *because His name is on us!* 

And here's the thing...God is the Creator; the Manufacturer, if you will. There is no problem we can have that is to big for God to fix. He knows every one of us, inside and out, and better than we know ourselves, because he made us. He knows what we were designed to do, and what we need to be effective and productive.

Remember, though, that bearing God's name carries responsibility. People around us need to see that we bear the name of God, and they need to associate that name with righteousness. With quality. Pray that God helps you see things that need to be fixed, and that people might see God in your actions!
