Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As impossible as it seems, March is already upon us. We look forward to the coming of Spring, with its promise of new life, the color green, basketball, and of breaking the grip of winter. This year, March is busy with activity as well. And right in the middle of all the holidays is St. Patrick's Day. It seems to me that Americans love to celebrate this day, but really have no clue who St. Patrick was!

For example, how many people realize that St. Patrick was not Irish? He was born, somewhere around 385 AD, in Scotland! He can't really be called a Scot, though, because his parents were actually Romans, who were living there as part of the Roman rule of Britain. When Patrick was about 14 years old, he was captured by a raiding party from Ireland, and drug off in captivity.

Ireland was not ruled by the Romans, and Christianity was not known there. They were druids and pagans, and Patrick was forced into slavery as a sheep herder. Naturally, he slowly learned the language and the people, but he turned to God for strength. It is said that he would pray as much as one hundred times a day, and that much again at night. One night, when Patrick was twenty, God spoke to him in a dream.

After six years of captivity and forced labor, Patrick dreamt that God told him to escape to the coast. He fled, and probably walked some 200 miles before he hopped a ship bound for Britain, and was reunited with his family. Patrick never forgot his reliance upon God, however, and continued his habit of prayer. Not long after his return he had another profound dream. Whereas God spoke to him directly in the first, this time he saw the Irish people begging him to return "to come and walk among us once more." He began to study at St. Martin's monastery in Tours, France, and was soon ordained as a bishop and commissioned to return to Ireland.

Bishop Patrick landed in Ireland on March 25, 433 AD, this time as a free man. Charged with spreading the Gospel to the Irish, he began preaching, and would continue to do so for 40 years. As he explained the mysteries of God to a pagan people, he used symbols and ideas they were familiar with. For example, druids were used to worshipping the sun, so he overlaid the cross over an image of the sun, and so created the Celtic Cross we see today.

A similar reason explains the connection between St. Patrick and the three leaf clover. As he tried to explain the nature of the Trinity, he bent down one day and picked a clover from the ground. Holding it up, he explained that the clover also had three parts, but made one clover.

St. Patrick died on March 17, 460, which is why we celebrate on the 17th. As we celebrate this year, remember that it is a day about more than just green beer and funny little plastic hats. It is a day honoring a great evangelist and man of God. And whenever you see a clover, remember his message and his incredible life.
