Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What is the purpose of your life? Ever wonder what God wants you to do? What would happen if you rejected that purpose?

Some time ago, I went to a birthday party for my brother-in-law. You would have to know him to truly understand what that's like, but suffice it to say that life around him is always loud, crazy, and full of joyous laughter. At this party, he shared a story from his youth, when he was a paperboy, maybe in the third grade. There was one part of his route in particular that he hated because there were huge dogs that chased him down the street, and they were always right at his heels as he pedaled furiously down the road. One day, he decided he really didn't want to do that again, so he hid all the papers under his dad's car. Of course, the phone calls started rolling in, and the paper investigated. When confronted by his mom, he said some guy had been following him, and he must have picked up all the papers after he delivered them (ya right). Needless to say, he was summarily fired. This is what happens when you reject your employer's purpose for you!

Luke 7 shows part of the ongoing conflict between Jesus and the Pharisees, as well as the roll that John the Baptist plays in all this, and verse 30 says, "But the Pharisees and experts in the law rejected God's purpose for themselves, because they had not been baptized by John." Clearly, rejecting God's purpose for your life is serious business, but what exactly is that purpose?

One thing we can learn about this purpose is made clear by Luke's understanding of what John's baptism really meant. John taught that there was a different way to be right with God, different than the Temple's sacrificial system. He taught that right standing with God came

through repentance of sin. The Pharisees rejected this in part because they held to the Temple system, and in part because they didn't really think they had a whole lot of sin to repent for!

But more than that, the reason God put the Temple system in place to begin with was so that the people could be close to God and worship Him. Over the years, Temple leaders forgot this purpose and actually made it more difficult! One example is in the story that immediately follows, in verses 36-50. A woman, who knew the Pharisees didn't like her or approve of her, showed up at one of their houses. Predictably, she was insulted and shunned by the owner, and Jesus used the opportunity to teach something about the nature of God and God's purpose for the woman.

You see, the purpose for her life was to repent of her sin, be forgiven, and begin to praise and worship God. This is God's purpose for everyone, from the lowest sinner to the highest religious leader. That's God's purpose for everyone, but if you claim the Lord as your God, your purpose is also to lead others into that relationship with God, through Jesus Christ. The Pharisees rejected both of these purposes. And what happens when you reject your purpose? You get fired, as the Pharisees would soon be.

So what is the purpose for your life? To turn away from sin and, since you're a Christian, to help others do the same. Don't reject that purpose. Love and serve Him!
