Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Forgiveness is a tricky matter.

Alex Rodriguez, a baseball player for the New York Yankees until 2016, was accused in 2013 of using steroids to enhance his on-field performance. He was eventually suspended for the entire 2014 season. After composing a lengthy letter of apology by hand, he was forgiven and allowed to rejoin the Yankees in 2015.

Forgiveness for King Henry II, though, was not so easy. He had an ongoing battle with Thomas Becket, Archbishop of Canterbury. On Dec. 29, 1179, he famously exclaimed "Will no one rid me of this turbulent priest?" That night, Becket was murdered within the walls of the church by 4 knights responding to the King's comment. The king was upset that Becket had been killed, but it would take more than a simple letter for him to be forgiven! In order to reestablish a relationship with the Pope, he had to agree to go on a crusade, as well as abolish several practices to which the Church objected. Furthermore, he had to seek public forgiveness by submitting to being beaten with a rod 5 times from each of the bishops present at Canterbury Cathedral, and another 3 times from each of the 80 monks cloistered there. Then, to top it all off, he had to spend the night in the crypt, next to Becket's tomb!

Now most of us have not used steroids like that, nor inadvertently caused someone's murder, but we've all sinned, and we all need God to forgive us. But what do we need to do in order to be forgiven? Turns out the Bible is pretty clear. Thankfully we don't need to sleep in a cemetery. 1 John 1:9 says, "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness." The idea of confession is not just us admitting we're wrong, but also understanding our need to change. We turn away from that behavior, wanting to change.

We usually focus on the word 'confess', because we wonder just what that entails. But in keeping our focus there, we usually miss the significance of the word 'if.' Meaning if we don't, our forgiveness is not guaranteed by God's faithfulness and justness. It's a mighty big 'if.'

But don't forget about what Jesus taught us in the Lord's Prayer: that forgiveness also hinges on our willingness to forgive others (forgive us...as we forgive others). This would be part of what John calls 'walking in the light' in 1 John 1:7. In other words, we not only have to be willing to confess our sins, but we also have to be willing to show other people the thing we hope to receive from God!

So what do we need to do in order to be forgiven? We must confess what we've done wrong, but also demonstrate God's forgiveness toward others. That's easier than being beaten by 80 monks, most of the time anyway!
