Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

There is no time like the holidays! It is at this time of the year that families frequently travel in order to be with their closest relatives. People all across the country will gather together once again, spend way too much on presents, eat waaayyyy too much, and generally figure out how to drive each other crazy. With all the disrupted schedules, massive preparation efforts, and budgets stretched to the breaking point, it is no wonder that alcohol consumption skyrockets this time of year!

But we have an opportunity here as well. Christmas is more than just a time to get together with family you haven't seen in a while to swap expensive presents. It is a chance to reunite with the people you love. It is an opportunity to reexamine the miraculous story of Jesus' birth. And it is a time to teach.

I think that, like it or not, the world is a changing place in respect to its relationship with Christianity. What's more, I think it is becoming more and more pronounced as the years go by. For example, a couple years ago we would have been shocked beyond belief to hear of a Christian inner-city mission that was not allowed to serve food to the homeless simply because they were a religious organization. But no longer. A couple years ago, the idea of atheists banding together to form their own mega-churches would have been laughable and strange, but today people that deny the existence of any god gather together once a week to sing, discuss morality, and then hang around for cookies and coffee afterward! (These are primarily on the West coast, but still....)

The world, it seems, is telling Christians more and more that we are no longer needed. And our kids are already being confronted by it every day.

Our kids need to be in church every week, of course. We need to communicate to

them the importance of intentional and committed participation throughout a lifetime, and of the importance of regular worship. Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it." This means that when we carefully teach a child, those instructions will always be a part of their life. When they are challenged by opposition to Christian morals, they will have that sense of right and wrong ingrained in their psyche. Even if they are swayed for a time by these arguments, their Bible training will not leave them.

But Christmas is a chance for us to teach those that don't normally come to church. Like Christians used to do a long time ago, use Christmas to teach. 'You want to talk about how light returns to a dark world around Winter Solstice? Let me tell you about Jesus, and what he's done for me!' 'You want to give presents? Let me tell you about when kings traveled to give incredible gifts to a baby! Let me tell you about Jesus, and what he's done for me!'

Christmas is a time to, once again, retell the story of how God became a man, came to earth to live a sinless life, died for the sins of the world, but ultimately overcame death and the power of sin by rising up from death on the third day. Christmas is a time to share the basis for a moral code based on something more than current popular opinion. Christmas is a time to show kids the importance of family, of love, and of giving.

Share the story of Christmas with the young ones in your family. Share the story of why you became a Christian so that they will understand when you are no longer able to explain. Train your children, and they will be unable to turn from it!
