Grace and Peace to you,

Time is such a funny thing. One day, when I was on wheat harvest, time seemed to stop for a moment. It was the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, and just after someone lit one of those big mortars that you drop in a tube, a puff of wind blew the tube over and launched the thing; directly under our fuel truck. I distinctly remember watching it roll, and then explode. I was running (we all were), and I have this mental picture of me, frozen in time with both feet off the ground, and seeing all those beautiful colors illuminate the truck from underneath, sparks shooting in all directions. In that moment, time seemed to come to a standstill.

On the other hand, it sometimes feels like time speeds up and elapses faster, giving us sayings like, "Time flies when you're having fun!"

Either way, it somehow never seems like we have enough time to get everything we need to get done completed.

For us, time flows in one direction: from the past to the present, and on toward the future. This is how we understand the laws of cause and effect that we encounter every day; something in the past happened, and that affects the present and/or the future. Things that will happen in the future, however cannot affect things from the past. True, events in the future might affect our perception of past events, but they cannot change the events themselves. This is what humans are used to. All of science relies on cause/effect relationships governed by this concept. But this is *not* what happens when we are talking about the church and the reign of God. Allow me to explain.

In his book, *Evangelism After Christendom*, Bryan Stone talks about

salvation and the church's role in it. "The salvation offered by the church to the world is not something it first receives and then offers to others. It is received only and insofar as it is offered to others." In other words, a future cause (the church's salvation) has a present effect (the church offering salvation to others.) Time runs backwards!

Other examples are easy to conjure. One example might be The Lord's Prayer, which states that we receive forgiveness as we forgive others. We receive forgiveness only and insofar as we forgive others. Furthermore, Christians are called to share their faith with others, and when they do they receive faith. Normal time does not permit someone to share something, either forgiveness or faith, and then end up with more forgiveness and faith, but such is the nature of the reign of God. Time appears to run backwards.

What this means for Christians today is that we shouldn't worry so much about not having everything perfect in our lives before we talk to our friends about Jesus, or know the Bible completely before we lead a Sunday School class, or whatever. It is in the sharing that we gain.

The God that created time wants to bless you and enrich you, but also wants you to grow and mature in service and love. Step out in faith to teach, lead, serve, or however God is calling you. And as you do, God will give you the faith, skills, and forgiveness you need. It's about time!
