Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms." (Ephesians 6:12)

Once again, our country has been stung by the venom of hatred. On August 27, a young man entered the Annunciation Catholic School in Minneapolis, Minnesota, intent on killing innocent children there. And when he did, he released his venomous hatred into a culture already familiar with its effects. Predictably, just as when venom is injected into a body, the governing and controlling structures of our country went haywire. Democrats and Republicans wasted little time as they decried various social deficiencies. Democrats cried that more gun laws were needed, even as Republicans cried the answer was less. Republicans denounced Democrats for politicizing a tragedy, even as Democrats did the same. Religious leaders, not to be outdone, chimed in, saying that the country needs more Christian morality. At the same time, agnostics and atheists pointed their fingers straight at Christianity, even targeting prayer.

And the whole time, while all these contingents battled it out in the news media, over social media, and in person, people on every side tried to marginalize their perceived opponents. People tried to shout louder than

their foes. People tried to silence dissenting voices. People tried to mischaracterize their adversaries. And in so doing, people propagated and disseminated hatred and intolerance for their fellow Americans and fellow human beings. *And hatred did not die.*

But Paul, in the book of Ephesians, defined our enemy differently. Our true adversaries are not people, no matter where they stand on a particular issue. Our true adversaries are not Republican, Democrat, religious or not. Our true enemies are the powers and spiritual forces that drive the tensions we experience. Our struggle is against hatred itself. Our fight is against the hateful attitudes that left 2 people dead that day, yes. But it is also against the persistent animosity left in its wake. Our battle is with the spiritual forces that create and sustain the bitterness and enmity we experience, as well as with the bitterness and enmity itself.

And how do we fight hatred without creating more? With love. Patient, kind, generous, modest, humble, honoring, serving longsuffering, and forgiving love. (1 Cor 13:4-5)

We need less hate. Racial, political, theological. We need more love. Even when we don't want to, we must love one another. For Christ's sake. For our sake.

Paper Goods (toilet tissue, paper towels, napkins, facial tissue)


Pastas (macaroni, noodles, spaghetti)
