Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Whew! Anyone else feel a little relieved that the craziness of the Christmas Season is behind us? Even a glance at our calendar on the back page shows that things have slowed down a bit – good news for those of us that need to catch our breath a little.

But wait! There's one more Christmas-related date coming! Epiphany always comes on January 6. It is a date celebrated by the church, but no one else seems to recognize it. There are no sales at the stores, unions don't ask for holiday pay, and even the banks will still be open that day. What is Epiphany?

Epiphany is the date in which the church remembers the visit of the Magi. You remember the wise men from your nativity scene? That's them. There's even a Christmas carol about them: We Three Kings. But there seems to be a little confusion surrounding their story.

First of all, they're in nativity sets all over the country, and they probably should not be included. At least not right away. When we read their story in Matthew 2:1-12, we see that they showed up some time later, perhaps as much as two years later. So if you want to include the wise men in your nativity and have it be sort of accurate, you should set up the manger in your living room and the wise men probably just the other side of Topeka.

Not terribly practical. Which is possibly why people just shrug their shoulders and set them up next to the manger!

There are other misconceptions as well. Let's look at the carol for a moment.

“We Three...”

Hold it. Reading Matthew 2, we have no idea how many people there were. There were three gifts: gold, frankincense, and myrrh, sure. But it's speculation to say there were only three.

“Kings...”

Uh oh. Depending on the version you are reading, it will say these people were either wise men or magi, but no one calls them kings. They were astrologers, learned scholars, but not rulers like we would think of a king today.

“Of Orient...”

Pure conjecture. Most likely they were from the Middle East, like Persia.

This is not to say that remembering Epiphany is a total waste of time. Nor is the song we sing about it. The word Epiphany, apart from its meaning inside the church, means a sudden revelation or understanding. What is revealed to Matthew's readers is that not only was Jesus God (born of a virgin, Ch1), but that God revealed his divine nature to Gentiles as well. Profound!

And the carol “We Three Kings” is worth keeping around, if only for the final words of its chorus. “O star of wonder, star of night, star with royal beauty bright, westward leading, still proceeding, guide us to thy perfect light.” The star is not asked to guide *by* its perfect light, but rather *to* its perfect light. The perfect light of the Star of Bethlehem was none other than Jesus.

Poetic. Beautiful. Insightful. And worth remembering well past Christmas!
